WE REMEMBER

Jesus told us to remember him by acting the story of his last supper with his disciples. Listen to what happened.

Two of Jesus' disciples went to an upstairs room in Jerusalem to prepare a supper for Jesus. It was the time of the Jewish Passover festival.

In the evening Jesus and his disciples met in the upstairs room for the supper. While they were eating, Jesus took a piece of bread and said a prayer of thanks. Then he broke the bread and gave it to his disciples. As he did, he said to them, 'Take this bread and eat it; this is my body which is given for you.' Then he took a cup of wine and thanked God for that too. He passed the cup around his disciples for them all to drink from it. As they drank he said to them, 'This is my blood which is poured out for many people for their sins to be forgiven. Do this to remember me.'
